## ONTARIO ENERGY BOARD OBJECTIVES

- To facilitate competition and the smooth transition to competition
- To provide non-discriminatory access to transmission and distribution systems
- To protect the interests of consumers with respect to price, reliability and quality of electricity
- To promote economic efficiency in the generation, transmission and distribution of electricity
- To facilitate the maintenance of a financially viable electricity industry
- To facilitate energy efficiency


## ONTARIO ENERGY BOARD ACTS, 1998

- Sets out the requirement for a licence
- OEB to set codes, standards, conditions and requirements
- OEB to set rates for transmission and distribution services
- OEB to approve distribution and transmission system expansion
- OEB to approve mergers, acquisitions and divestitures


## LICENCES SCHEDULE FOR ISSUANCE

- Transitional Distribution Licences
- Transitional distribution licences effective April 1, 1999 issued to MEUs
- Transmission Licences
- Transitional licences to be issued this summer
- Generator Licences
- Transitional licences to be issued this summer


## LICENCES SCHEDULE FOR ISSUANCE

Continued

- Retailer Licences
- Licences to be issued this fall
- Residential consumer contracts allowed later this year
- Wholesaler Licences
- To be issued before market opens
- IMO Licence
- Transitional licences to be issued in July


## CODES

- For Electricity Distributors
- Affiliate Relationships Code (approved by the Board, effective October 1, 1999)
- Standard Service Supply Code (Board proceeding)
- Distribution System Code (Industry-led task force)
- Retail Settlement Code (Industry-led task force)
- For Electricity Transmitters
- Affiliate Relationships Code (approved by the Board, effective October 1, 1999)
- Transmission System Code (to be developed through stakeholder consultation)

## Continued

- For Electricity Retailers and Gas Marketers
- Gas Marketers Code of Conduct (approved by the Board)
- Electricity Retailers Code of Conduct (Board receiving stakeholder comments on draft code)


## TRANSITIONAL RATE ORDERS

- 1999 Rates Schedules were approved by Ontario Hydro for most MEUs
- On April 1, 1999 Ontario Hydro ceased to exist
- OEB Rate Orders confirmed the 1999 rates

- Criteria and Guidelines on mergers, acquisitions and divestitures - fall 1999
- Uniform System of Accounts - Board receiving stakeholder comments, final USoA approved by the Board in Fall, expected implementation January, 2000
- Criteria and Guidelines on system expansion expected in Fall 1999 (Section 92 not yet proclaimed)
