- The Energy East pipeline will help provide the capacity necessary to facilitate continued growth in Canada's oil development sector and will help reduce the bottleneck that is currently causing Canada to sell our natural resources at a discounted rate in global markets.
- Summit has NO contractual relationship with TransCanada for any work on Energy East, but Summit is a registered vendor for the project.
- Regardless of the successful contractors or the specifics of TransCanada's
  contract strategy, this project will provide a much needed economic boost to
  our local contractors, local businesses, local tradesmen and many of our
  depressed rural communities that have not seen projects of this magnitude
  since the last major pipeline construction projects in the 1990s.
- The Energy East project will provide contractors and our labour partners
  with an opportunity to engage and recruit local residents into well paying
  apprenticeship and entry-level positions that provide these individuals with
