

Residential Normalized Average Use Vs Gas Supply Charge




1995-2005, average use decline 35 m³ or 1.2% per year 2001-2005, average use decline 53 m³ or 1.8% per year



Rate 6 Normalized Average Use




1995-2005, average use decline 24 m³ or 0.11% per year

Reasons for the Decline in Average Use




- More efficient gas appliances
- Better home insulation
- Customer response to higher natural gas prices
- Unlike electricity there are no new uses for natural gas such as gas powered computers, cellphones, MP3 players and iPods
