Hydro One shall use all reasonable efforts to provide oral or written notice to 27 landowners a minimum of 48 hours prior to entry. Unless otherwise agreed upon 28 with landowners, access is to be limited for a subsequent 5 day window in which 29 early access activities could then occur. All access activities shall only take place 30 during weekdays and not statutory holidays and between the hours of 8 am and 5 31 pm. (Example: Hydro One will provide notice by Friday for a 5 day access 32 window beginning the next Monday and until and including the following Friday; 33 all access activities will occur during this period between the hours of 8 am and 5 34 pm). 35 36 3. Where Hydro One has not been able to contact a landowner prior to access, Hydro 37 One shall keep a record of activities conducted and make it available to the 38 landowner upon request. 39 40

In the event soil testing activities are planned to be conducted on lands with 32 tracked equipment, Hydro One will use all reasonable efforts to consult with the 33 landowner in advance of entry and provide a sketch depicting the access route and 34 the location of the soil testing activities. Such notification and consultation with 35 the landowner will occur at minimum 5 days prior to entry. This period of time is 36 intended to provide landowners with the opportunity to indicate the locations of 37 any special fixtures (such as wells, tile drainage or septic areas) that are to be 38 avoided while soil testing activities are carried out. 39 40 7. Reasonable accommodation is to be made to the early access schedule for 41 landowner requests/concerns to ensure access activities do not interfere with 42
