## Ontario Energy Board (Board Staff) INTERROGATORY #18 (Prefiled Evidence)

## **Interrogatory**

Is there a distinction between duplicating an existing wires system and making an investment to replace an aging and potentially obsolete distribution system? Please discuss.

## **Response**

Yes.

Networks does not duplicate any parts of its distribution wires system. Investments are made to replace and/or reinforce assets when parts of the system are no longer capable of providing the necessary level of service to customers (e.g., either capacity, service quality, or useful end of life). Construction of new facilities (i.e., station/feeder) that duplicate existing facilities with remaining useful service life leads to assets that become underutilized or stranded.

Networks does not replace whole distribution systems (e.g., an entire line) but rather component parts which have differing life spans (e.g., transformers vs. wood poles) and are replaced as required based on technical and economic considerations.
