Networks concludes that under certain circumstances it would be more economic for an alternative distributor to connect customers.

Reference: p. 3 L1-7

Could the same conclusion be reached for connections within the service area of the incumbent distributor as well as on the border between two distributors? If not, please explain why embedded distribution could not be used to provide similar economic benefits within an incumbent's territory.

Response

No. The circumstances are different because the applicant distributor referenced by Networks would be building out from its own neighbouring service territory at a lower incremental cost of connection for a customer and would not result in the under-utilization or even stranding of assets. A similar result could not occur with a new distributor fully embedded in the incumbent distributor's service territory because both the incumbent and the applicant new embedded distributor would have to construct distribution facilities from the same point.
