

## Ontario's System-Wide Electricity Supply Mix: 2000 Data

Phase I of Ontario's Environmental Labelling Program began on March 1, 2000, under the Ontario Energy Board's *Directive for the Disclosure of Information to Consumers by Electricity Retailers under Ontario Regulation 416/99*. This Directive prescribes the manner and timing requirements of Phase I labelling. Under the Directive, retailers and providers of Standard Supply Service are required to provide Ontario's electricity supply mix information to consumers using one of two label formats. These formats are provided in the Directive under Appendices A and B.

Under O. Reg. 416/99, the Ministry of Energy, Science and Technology is responsible for providing Ontario's supply mix data for electricity suppliers. The following chart shows the supply mix data for 2000, as determined by the Ministry. This data should be considered current until further notice.

<i>Electricity Sources</i>	<i>System-Wide Electricity Supply Mix (2000)</i>
Water power	26%
Alternative Power Sources	1%
Nuclear Energy	37%
Natural Gas	7%
Coal or Oil	29%
