


Bluewater Power Distribution Corporation has applied to the Ontario Energy Board to raise its electricity distribution rates effective May 1, 2023. If the application is approved as filed, a typical residential customer and a typical general service customer of Bluewater Power Distribution Corporation would see the following increase. Residential 750 kWh \$3.55 per month

\$5.40 per month 50kW (2,000 kWh) Other customers, including businesses, will also be affected.
